City of Walterboro 2024 City Council Retreat Walterboro Wildlife Center January 12, 2024

On January 12, 2024, Bill Tomes and Ali Moriarty facilitated a planning retreat for the City of Walterboro Council. After brief introductions, City executive staff gave Council an update on progress on goals set at the 2023 retreat. Significant progress has been made on several of the 2023 goals, with the next steps reflected in the 2024-25 goals. Notable achievements include funding for the Exit 57 Trunk Line, the completion of Phase 2 of the I-95 Business Loop project, a plan for an overlay district for the South Jefferies corridor, and the mitigation of flooding on Washington St.

After discussion of progress on current goals and current/future plans, Council and staff set the following 18 goals, key results, and target dates for FY 2024-25:

• Expand Water and Sewer

- 1. Identify existing sewer lines without recorded easements (ongoing).
- 2. Complete permitting process and begin construction on Exit 57 Trunk Line by December 31, 2024.
- 3. Identify funding sources to upgrade Exit 53 sewer by June 30, 2024.
- 4. Develop expansion plan for northwest Walterboro water and sewer by Dec. 31, 2024.

• Improve Overall Appearance of City

- 1. I-95 Business Loop Project Phase 3 select engineer, begin design and engineering by April 1, 2024.
- 2. Complete demolition of Ford dealership property by March 31, 2024; have a redevelopment plan completed by June 30, 2024; short-term beautification of nearby buildings by June 30, 2024.
- 3. Apply for funding for middle school demolition by Dec. 31, 2024.
- 4. Finalize the timeline for the Ireland Creek project by June 30, 2024.
- 5. Develop master plan for City Hall complex by September 30, 2024.
- 6. Identify chronic litter violators (via committee) by Dec. 31, 2024.

• Growth Management

- 1. Identify places for residential development to include workforce housing by June 30, 2024.
- 2. Achieve donut hole annexation (Shannon Drive) through marketing city benefits, council member interaction and incentives by Dec. 31, 2024.
- 3. Increase traffic enforcement to reduce speeding by March 31, 2024.

Recreation/Tourism

- 1. Complete design and begin construction (including burying utilities) of Water Tower Park by June 30, 2024.
- 2. Complete construction on Phase 1 and begin design and engineering on Phase 2 of the boardwalk renovation project by September 30, 2024.
- 3. Identify alternate site to be purchased for Southside Park and explore funding options by Dec. 31, 2024.
- 4. Gather information about adding a dog park by Dec. 31, 2024.
- 5. Install at least 2 EV charging stations by Dec. 31, 2024.



Subject: Walterboro Wildlife Sanctuary Phase II & Phase III Tree Removal

The City of Walterboro Parks Department was tasked with soliciting bids for the tree removal and cleanup of sections of Walterboro Wildlife Sanctuary including the boardwalks and bridges over Ireland Creek and the section of park north of Ivanhoe Rd known as the Beech Hill Loop. This project will eliminate hazardous and potentially hazardous trees and debris ahead of any future reconstruction of boardwalks, trails, and bridges within the Walterboro Wildlife Sanctuary.

On February 9th, 2024, the Parks Department received (3) bids as the result of a Bid Packet emailed to interested parties on January 30th, 2024.

Contractor

- 1. H2O Mitigation \$59,500.00
- 2. Lowcountry Tree and Limb \$ 92,000.00
- 3. Murdaugh Tree Service \$195,500.00

These bids represent a timeframe of work to be performed from $\frac{2}{15}/2024 - \frac{4}{15}/2024$.

I recommend that we award the contract to H2O Mitigation as they are the lowest bid.



Additional Notes:

- ***All felled trees and large limbs 6-8" and bigger, and vertical in appearance, must be bucked and cut into sections between 36-48" or within a reasonable size range to allow for easy movement by a small tractor and to accommodate for future construction projects and movement of machinery within the worksite.
- ***A reasonable attempt must be made to fell trees away from creeks/ streams/ or discharge points to minimize damming/ sedimentation/ or blockage of water.
- *** Trees for removal are marked with either orange vertical paint stripes or orange flagging tape.
- *** Bidding Contractor's must perform an onsite inspection of the worksite prior to a bid submittal
- *** Phase II constitutes the area surrounding the DeTreville Trail area from Bridge 1 to Bridge 2 and the Covered Bridge Trail area as identified on the attached map.
- *** Phase III constitutes the area including the Beach Hill Trail and Bridges and the Beach Hill Loop Boardwalk. This area is bounded by Ivanhoe Rd. to the South and Beach Road to the North. Please consult the attached map for details.
- ***Phase III upland area aesthetic tree removal constitutes removal of initial 18ft of the tree crown or trunk away from boardwalk/ the rest of the tree trunk may remain in place/ bucked sections may be disposed in area outside the boardwalk perimeter and designated at the discretion of the City Representative.
- *** Phase III area aesthetic clean-up of downed trees in upland areas will require consultation with the City Representative on a tree-by-tree basis to determine the instance and location of tree mass removal and re-depositing of debris.
- ***The awarded contractor must perform the job between the dates of February 15th, 2024 April 15th, 2024. This schedule is non- negotiable due to federal regulations regarding the Northern Long Eared Bat.
- ***A small tractor may be used to aid in tree felling and debris cleanup; however, the contractor **must make a reasonable effort** to reduce soil erosion potential and damage to the existing boardwalks, bridges, and trails.


